Hispanic/Latino Ethnicity Identification

Yes, Hispanic/Latino: a person of Cuban, Dominican, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, Spanish, or other Hispanic culture of origin, regardless of race. The following is a list of Hispanic ancestry groups to which Hispanic/Latino individuals may refer to themselves. If parents/guardians are unsure of their child's ethnicity, but the parents/guardians identify their child as one of the following Hispanic ancestry groups (see list below), the child should be reported as **Yes, Hispanic/Latino**. It is also important to note that any race or races may be reported if a child is identified as **Yes, Hispanic/Latino**.
