Any elementary, middle or high school student in South Dakota is eligible to take courses via the South Dakota Virtual School.



STEP 1: Accessing the SPED Contracted Services Screen

- Open the PRF. Click on “Actions”, “District Information” and then “SD Virtual School”.



STEP 2: Updating the SD Virtual School Screen.

- The SD Virtual School screen must be accessed and the question – “Do you offer classes through the South Dakota Virtual School?” must be answered.
- This screen is divided into three types of information:
 - Elementary
 - Middle School
 - High School
